

Computer Science Program on Horizon at Connors State College

Big news! Connors is currently developing new courses in computer science. This comes in response to continued employment demand in computer and technology occupations. Jobs in this sector are projected to grow 13% from 2020 to 2030, faster than the average of all other occupations, according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Students will have a variety of choices in computer science at Connors State College. The program will offer students various options in the A.S. degree in Computer Science, embedded certificates, and an A.A.S. degree in Information Technology, after completion of the rigorous Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education approval process.

Courses in Web Development/HTML, Computer Science Logic & Algorithms, Java, Principles of Information Security, Computer Forensics, and many more will be offered in the upcoming semesters. New COMS courses will be taught online.

Another noteworthy development is the addition of two focused courses that prepare students to take external exams through CompTIA to earn the nationally recognized A+ credential. A+ preparation courses are offered in two parts. A+ I is offered in the fall semester, and A+ II is offered in the spring semester. CompTIA A+ certification prepares students for jobs such as IT support specialist, IT field service technician, desktop support analyst, and help desk tier 2 support.

Students pursuing an A.S. Degree in Business Administration or in General Studies will find that electives in (COMS) computer science are a great addition to their degrees! Ask your Academic Advisor how COMS electives can fit your schedule.
