Connors Hosts 75th Annual Aggie Day Interscholastic

The 75th Aggie Day Interscholastic at Connors State College is now in the books. Aggie Day's mission is to provide a Career Development Training Competition for 4H and FFA members in agriculture related industries including: Land Evaluation; Rangeland Management; Soil and Water Conservation; Livestock Judging; Poultry Evaluation; Natural Resources and Ecology Management; Agriculture Communications; Food Science and Safety; Agronomy; Entomology; Farm Business Management; Veterinary Science; Milk Quality and Dairy Foods; Electricity; Meat Evaluation; Floriculture, and Nursery and Landscape.

Over 2100 students were in attendance with advisors, drivers and guests present at this anniversary event. There were 472 teams representing 210 schools in 17 career development events, in 20 contests from 5 states. This was up from 160 schools in 2021. There were schools and 4-H clubs or counties from Arkansas, Kansas, Oklahoma, Missouri, and Texas in competition as well. Results will be posted on our web page and at judgingcard.com.

Connors State Well Represented at Higher Ed Day

Students and personnel from Oklahoma's state system institutions gathered at the State Capitol in Oklahoma City Tuesday to demonstrate the value and importance of higher education in the state.

Speakers included Gov. Kevin Stitt, Sec. Ryan Walters, Speaker Charles McCall, Sen. Roger Thompson, Rep. Kevin Wallace, Sen. Adam Pugh, State Regents chair Jeffrey W. Hickman, and Chancellor Allison D. Garrett.

"Students, faculty and staff from Oklahoma's public colleges and universities came together today at our State Capitol to highlight the value of a college degree," said Chancellor Garrett. "Among our state's critical occupations, 47 of the top 50 highest paying jobs require a college degree. U.S. Census Bureau data show that individuals with an associate degree earn almost \$1,000 more per month than those with just a high school diploma, and individuals with a bachelor's degree earn over \$2,000 more per month than high school graduates. Public higher education is critical to strengthening Oklahoma's economy and building our workforce, and must be a top state priority."

Four students also spoke at the event including Connors' own, Katelynn Lewis. These student leaders shared how pursuing a degree at an Oklahoma public college or university has positively impacted their lives

Connors State Women's basketball wrapped up their season on March 2nd after their contest against Murray State College at Oklahoma Baptist University. The Cowgirls scored 1,724 points this season across 31 games and picked up conference wins against Seminole State and Western Oklahoma State. Leading the team in scoring this season was Sophomore London Scott, who tallied 240 points on the year. Scott also cleaned up the glass this year for the Cowgirls, tallying 153 rebounds on the year while Makayla Adams led the team in assists with 93.

The Cowgirls will miss the presence of sophomore leadership from this years team that featured 7 second or third year players.
