**Generally projects require 4 weeks to process and be indicated on a student's transcript, be aware of this, especially if the student is in their final semester before graduation.

The following information is the general requirements of the project, consult your faculty member or the Honors Coordinator before making any changes.

Summarized Description of the Proposed Project and Topic:

- Each semester the Honors Project Coordinator will select a book for this project. Students may select any major or minor topic addressed in the book to research and prepare their presentation. Check your email or contact the Coordinator with any questions.

Specific Criteria of the Project:

- Create a PowerPoint or Prezi with at least 12 slides.
- Presentations must include at least 3 images or graphics that aid in clearly communicating the information. Be sure to cite images as appropriate.
- In addition to citation of images, presentations must contain at least 5 citations from academically credible sources.
- All citations must appear as the information is used within the slide presentation, as well as at the end on a final slide with the bibliography/works cited information. Use MLA, APA, Chicago or other appropriate style guide for all citations.

Rubric for Evaluating the Project:

- Student met the criteria as outlined in item #1 of the honors project contract.
- Student claims are supported by academically credible sources or appropriate details.
- Student presents information about the topic in a deliberate and organized manner, demonstrating an understanding of the topic.
- Student provides information that is logical and exhibits creative, original and/or insightful thought and/or research.
